50TH ANNIVERSARY DINNER FEATURES KEYNOTE JAKKI JEFFS, AFLO EXEC DIRECTOR

On Saturday, November 4th, approximately 125 people gathered at the Columbus Centre to celebrate RTL's 50th anniversary with a spaghetti dinner and to hear keynote speaker Jakki Jeffs, Executive Director of Alliance for Life Ontario (AFLO). This event closed the 1-year celebration of 50 years of Thunder Bay and Area Right to Life which officially began as an organization in December 1973. In her keynote address, Jakki spoke about euthanasia and abortion

being like 2 sides of a coin. She cited a recent study that showed that 70% of abortions are unwanted abortions, such as when women are coerced or even forced to choose to terminate a pregnancy. She challenged the audience to stay the course in defending all life, from conception and to resist the temptation to give in to the gestational approach to abortion restrictions. In recent email communications from Jakki through AFLO, she is calling on pro-lifeand-family people to contact their MP to thank them if they voted in favor of Bill C-314 and to strongly express dissatisfaction if they didn't. With the recent defeat of Bill C-314, which Jakki felt would have saved many lives, MAiD will

be available solely for mental illness beginning in March of 2024. (Locally MP Powlowski voted in favor of the Bill and MP Hajdu voted against.)

2023 LIFE CHAIN WELL-ATTENDED



Thunder Bay and Area Right to Life (RTL) organized participation in Life Chain, Campaign Life Coalition's (CLC) annual event which took place in over 300 locations across the country, between 2 and 3 p.m. on Sunday, October 1st. This year approxi-

mately 60 adults, plus many children, lined up along Balmoral Ave. for the silent prayerful witness for life. With CLC's permission, Euthanasia signs were included this year. As a tribute to the 50th Anniver-



sary year of Thunder Bay RTL, a reception for coffee and fellowship followed the Life Chain, where pro-life materials and resources, provided by RTL, were made available.


CAMPAIGN LIFE COALITION (CLC) CELEBRATING "HUGE PRO-LIFE-AND-FAMILY GAINS AT CPC CONVENTION"

In their October 2023 national newsletter, CLC is celebrating the successful passing of many pro-life-and-family policy resolutions at the Conservative Party of Canada (CPC) Convention that took place September 7-9 in Quebec City.

Some topics included gender ideology, child protection, informed consent, bodily autonomy, drug and substance abuse, palliative care and euthanasia. All 13 resolutions promoted by CLC were among the total of 29 from across the coun-



try that passed and of those <u>3 were from Thunder Bay!</u> Thunder Bay Rainy River's proposal on Vaccines (including addressing mandates) and a National Senior Strategy were well-supported by delegates. Thunder Bay Superior North's Euthanasia resolution also passed with support not only from delegates, but also from many MPs through a letter of support. RIGHT TO LIFE PRESENTATION AT PRAYERS FOR THE UNBORN

On June 12th, Board Member Stewart Rathje represented Right to Life at the annual Prayers for the Unborn, an annual event organized by the Knights of Columbus. He gave some highlights from the AGM keynote addresses by Lia Mills and Alex Schadenberg.

Lia Mills spoke about abortion and the connection between abortion and euthanasia, highlighting that killing a human being is never a solution to anything. The most obvious and most terrifying connection is that some are proposing Euthanasia be allowed for babies who are too difficult to care for. With abortion not being illegal, up to 9 months in the womb, it is not a far stretch to allow parents to euth-

anize a child that was defective or ill for up to a year after birth.

Alex's presentation contained many examples of how Canada's current Euthanasia law is not protecting the vulnerable, and has made MAiD an option for consideration by people experiencing poverty, homelessness, loneliness, and for non-life-threatening illnesses or whose death is not imminent.

Stewart also explained, "100,000 Canadians are lost to abortion every year - almost the entire population of Thunder Bay EVERY YEAR." "One in four do not make it out of the womb" which should be the safest place on earth. He challenged those present, "A belief in the sacredness and dignity of all human life, from conception to natural death, is an underlying belief of our Christian faith, so one could argue churches play a critical role and their voices should be the loudest."
